LOCAL RULES

1. All shingle drainage lines/ indentations should be treated as GUR and relief can be taken under rule 25-1(b)
2. The crossings on the 4th & 7th should be treated as immovable obstructions and relief can be taken under rule 24-2 or in the dropping zone indicated
3. **Out of bounds**
 - a. All boundaries of the course designated by either fences, hedges, and/or ditches.
 - b. The clubhouse surroundings and car park including the access road
 - c. The greenkeepers compound, defined by fence and / or white posts
 - d. Beyond the white stakes left of the 9th - Safety Note under no circumstances should a ball that is beyond these posts be played.
 - e. When playing the 14th, on or over the public footpath adjoining the left of the hole.
 - f. When playing the 13th hole beyond the white stakes to the right of the green.
 - g. 17th hole, beyond the white posts or course boundary right of the 17th hole
 - h. 18th hole, the 'short course' i.e. beyond the white posts right of the 18th hole.

Safe use of the facilities at Horsham Golf.

Players should be aware of the full guidance on use of the facilities available from the golf shop including the terms and conditions of use/membership including the guidance given below.

HEALTH AND SAFETY GUIDANCE

1. Golf Course

- a. Players should at all times be alert to the dangers of slips and trips on the golf course especially banks, slopes and damage caused by burrowing animals.
- i. We have a number of banks and slopes on the course players are advised that when walking over or around these banks that specific care is taken, particularly during wet or icy conditions, and should walk diagonally rather directly up or down these banks to be safe.
- ii. Players should use pathways at all times where provided
- b. Players should assess the dangers associated with underfoot conditions particularly when wet or after wet conditions and especially during frosty or icy times of the year and take appropriate action.
- c. Players should always ensure that appropriate golf footwear is used and that spikes or cleats are in good condition.
- d. Players should also be aware of the use of the warning word FORE and the dangers of possible errant golf shots played by themselves or other users of the course.
- e. Players are also advised to leave the course in the event of dangerous weather conditions including lightning or the potential of lightning as well as fog or conditions were they are unable to see other users such that they cannot make a safe decision to hit their next shot or continue playing safely.
- f. Players should be aware when searching for or approaching their golf ball in the vicinity of trees and/or shrubbery to be aware of low hanging branches, low or lying sticks, brambles or similar that may present a tripping or puncture injury hazard and take appropriate action. Particularly within home wood.

2. Public footpaths and byways

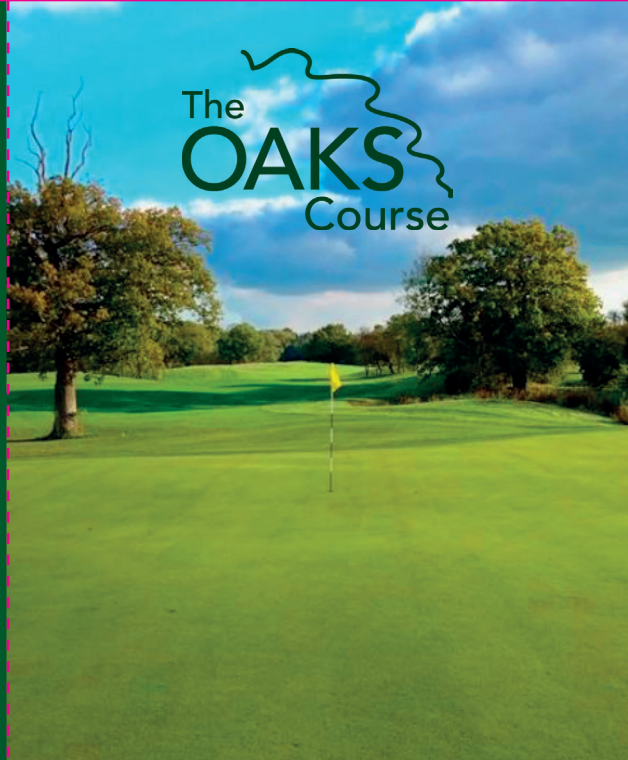
- a. Footpath PF1666 is clearly defined and runs between 17 and 18, around the west side of the buildings behind then left of the 16th green bordering the car park and access road, beside the 15th green and approach before crossing the 15th fairway and running between the 15th and 14th, it then runs beside the left of 5th before leaving the golf course. Players should at all times be aware of footpath users and give them priority allowing them to be a safe distance away before hitting any shot that could be dangerous.
- b. Public Byway PB1668 is clearly defined and crosses fairways 4 and 7 players should give priority to users before hitting any shot that could be dangerous to users of the byway.

3. Adjoining neighbours land

- a. When playing the:
 - i. 13th players are requested to respect or neighbours privacy and not retrieve balls from the area defined as out of bounds.
 - ii. 17th players are requested to respect our neighbours privacy and not retrieve balls from the area defined as out of bounds to the right of the hole.
